# Introduction to *Phil Ackland's Exhaust Cleaners Certification Protocol™*



The primary purpose of Phil Ackland's Exhaust Cleaners Certification Protocol is to provide the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) with a clearer understanding of NFPA Standard 96, which states (in part): *"...exhaust systems shall be (inspected and cleaned) by properly trained, qualified and certified company or person(s) acceptable to the authority having jurisdiction."* (See NFPA 96 8-3 - 1998 Edition, or NFPA 96 11.3 - 2001 Edition)

### Exactly what is meant by "Trained, Qualified and Certified"?

The Certification Protocol and corresponding Training Courses define these competency and instruction requirements. The Protocol will assist jurisdictions in recognizing the requirements a cleaning company and/or person (Crew Leader) should have to be considered 'acceptable' for the NFPA 96 definition of 'Trained, Qualified and Certified.'

Compliance rests most heavily on the cleaning companies involved. They are to be Registered and be responsible for their Crew Leaders. Conversely, the Crew Leaders Certification is tied to a Registered Company. The Protocol therein provides a balance of responsible documentation and consistent training that is not overly burdensome on either the companies or individuals, yet is useful to the AHJ to determine overall Competency.
